### TOPSHAM GARDEN CLUB TREASURER'S REPORT June 13, 2018

Checking Account Balance (as of June 12, 2018) Savings Account Balance (as of May 31, 2018) \$5,700.67 \$2,513.50\*\*

\*\* The Savings Account balance includes \$1,500 for a "Rainy Day Fund," \$1,000 reserved for a capital gift for the Androscoggin Brunswick-Topsham Riverwalk, and interest earned.

### **Membership:**

We currently have 32 members for 2018-2019, including three new members: Heather Osterfeld and Susan and Frank Tesar. Twenty 2017-2018 members have not yet renewed; Jerry Hix passed away in January and one is unable to renew, leaving 18 potential renewals. According to our By-laws, dues are payable due in full by June 15, 2018.

Dues (new or renewing members) are \$20 for an individual or \$30 for two members of the same household. Members joining December 1 or later paid half price until the April Annual Meeting when all dues collected are applied to the following year.

#### Fiscal Activity Since April 11, 2018, Business Meeting:

- Income was \$1,823:
  - o \$570 in dues from new and renewing members
  - o \$1,211 from the Plant Sale (not including \$12 IOU from a member)
  - o \$42 from the raffle of double snowdrops
- Expenses were \$152.31:
  - \$102.31 for two raffle items for the Medomak Disytrict Meeting and two for the upcoming GCFM Convention
  - \$50 donation to the GCFM Scholarship Fund as a program fee for the Dahlia presentation on April 11.
- Not yet paid: Plant Sale expenses of about \$40 for bookmarks, coffee and a storage bin and a new hose for the Library for \$25

#### **Fiscal Year Report (June 1, 2017 – May 31, 2018)**

- We began the year on June 1, 2017 with \$1,583.85 more in the checking account than anticipated when we adopted the 2017-2018 budget on April 5, 2017.
- Income of \$3,220 exceeded budget by \$770. The 2017 Plant & Yard Sale brought in \$1,908 almost double the budget of \$1,000. The Christmas Auction earned \$126 more than budgeted. On the other hand, we did not exhbit at the Topsham Fair so did not earn the \$150 budgeted prize money, and membership was down by \$20.
- Recurring expenses came under budget by \$818.40 for a varierty of reasons, outlined on the attached spreadsheet.
- We spent none of the \$450 budget for one-time expenses.
- Instead of taking \$45.04 from our Rainy Day Fund, we ended the year with a checking account balance was \$4,319.17.
- We earned a whopping \$2.50 in interest on our savings account that includes the \$1,500 Rainy Day Fund and \$1,000 for a Riverwalk gift.

#### **Upcoming Events:**

• GCFM Annual Convention, June 18-20, at Sebasco Harbor Estate in Phippsburg. The 2018-2019 budget proposed by the Executive Committee includes spending a portion of our accumulated surplus to subsidize attendance at the meeting: \$30 toward convention registration and \$25 for the luncheon following the business meeting. Reimbursement will be made after the convention. Details will be forthcoming.
