Raffle prizes are fully decorated artificial Christmas trees with packages underneath. Value of each is at least \$500.
- Jean Herlihy reported that the garden clean-up has been done at the town hall, the library, and the Topsham Welcome sign. She planted 100 daffodil bulbs to celebrate the centennial of the Suffragists' success in passing legislation to allow women to vote in the

state of Maine. Vicky or Ann will write an article for *The Forecaster* in the spring explaining the daffodil planting.

- The Christmas Party and pot-luck luncheon will be held on December 4 in the ballroom of the Holden-Frost House (The Highlands, Topsham). There will be an auction of new or gently used items. Details will follow.
- There will be a TGC meeting on January 8. Barry Jordan, Chair of Biology at Bowdoin College will speak on his work with conifer forests. He, with several colleagues, has recently received a grant from the National Science Foundation to study conifer forests from the Pacific Northwest to Florida.  - GCFM convention is June 16-17, 2020 in Bar Harbor. Venue is Atlantic Oceanside Hotel, 119 Eden St. Roger Swain will be the keynote speaker.
 - At the Fall Conference of the Medomak District of the GCFM, Pam Allen of Bath was given a <u>national award</u> as <u>Gardener of the Year!</u> Pam's gardens cover 5 acres, and she uses no pesticides! Her gardens are open to the public, and perhaps we might schedule a field trip to visit them.

New Business:

- <u>Maine Garden Day</u> is March 14 at Lewiston High School. There was discussion as to whether the TGC would support it by buying a sponsorship, which start at \$250. General opinion was that this might better be something coming from the GCFM.
- The <u>Annual Medomak District Meeting</u> is <u>May 4</u>, and will be at the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens. The entrance fee will be waived for the day. The Topsham Garden Club is responsible for the White Elephant Table (involves setting up, pricing, selling, and getting the money to the district treasurer). We are also responsible for providing two raffle items, each worth at least \$25.00. <u>Fay Eldred</u> will man the White Elephant Table, and <u>Lucette Musica</u> will provide the raffle items.
